PROBLEM ORIENTED POLICING

POP PROJECTS:

P.O.P. # 1-63 A day shift officer opened this project to address numerous calls for service due to neighbor disputes on Marilyn Terrace. This project is ongoing.

P.O.P. # 5-31 A day shift officer opened this project and worked with United Parcel Service facility managers at 150 S. Lombard Rd. in order to obtain floor plans for the facility. Additionally tours of the facility were done with officers in order for the officers to become familiar with the area in order to reduce response times in the event of an emergency. This project is ongoing.

P.O.P. # 3-58 The day shift worked with the midnight shift and Public Works in order to locate and report any inoperable street lights within the Village of Addison. This project was closed successfully on March 17.

P.O.P. # 4-51 A day shift officer opened this project after receiving information that a local business was improperly using vehicle registrations from vehicles that it was servicing. This project was closed successfully on March 27.

P.O.P. # 3-61 A day shift officer opened this project in order to review the Village of Addison ordinances in order to determine if additional ordinances need to be added or existing ordinances amended. This project is ongoing.

P.O.P. # 1-68 A day shift Community Service Officer initiated this project to address the issue of abandoned vehicles. 180 citations were issued and 18 vehicles were tagged to be towed. This project was closed successfully on June 20.

P.O.P. # 3-72 A day shift officer initiated this project to create a New Rental Property Owner notification system for the Police Department. This project was closed successfully on December 2.

SPECIAL ASSIGNMENTS

Officers were crossed trained in the radio room and the communication center personnel rode with our officers in order for them to obtain a better understanding of each others' duties and responsibilities.

Officers were crossed trained with the Tact Unit in order to increase their job knowledge and effectiveness.

Officers were assigned extra patrol around our school areas due to reports of attempt child pick ups. Their presence in the area provided a safe environment for the children going to and coming from school.

When manpower allowed, we had officers in plainclothes patrolling the high crime areas. Several arrests were made for drug possession, a stolen auto, and outstanding warrants.

Upon realizing that there was an increasing number of abandoned automobiles throughout the Village of Addison, a special project was developed in which 18 abandoned autos were tagged and 180 citations were issued.

Officer Sinkule participated at the Henry Hyde Center in order to cover for shortages in the crime prevention division.

The day shift participated in numerous combined traffic details with the traffic unit during the year in order to enforce traffic laws and provide a safe environment for the motoring public. These details included the following enforcement actions: seatbelt violations, speeding, heavy equipment theft, school zones, DUI enforcement, improper lane usage, improper stopping on roadway, registration violations and overweight truck violations.

During the week before Christmas, officers were assigned a walking detail throughout our retail shopping areas to deter retail thefts, prevent burglaries to vehicles, and enforce fire lane and handicapped parking restrictions while making positive public contacts with the business owners and shoppers.

During the week before Christmas, an extra un-manned patrol car was parked near the entrance of the Wal-Mart in order to deter retail thefts. There were no reported retail thefts or other criminal incidents that occurred during the time period that an unmarked car was parked near the store.

Goals for 2010

Goals set for the Day Shift during 2010 included:

- Have each officer assigned to the shift achieve the training mandated by the Police Department's training matrix.

Status: This goal was accomplished.

- To become more pro-active in anticipating the needs of the community and handle any and all complaints or concerns in a timely manner. This includes having our officers spending more time outside of the patrol vehicle interacting with our residents.

Status: This goal was accomplished.

- The day shift will concentrate on making the "High Crime Areas" safe during the times children are present and playing outside. This will involve the officers being crossed trained in gang and drug activity as well as working with the Building Department in order to address code violations

in a timely manner. We will utilize officers in marked and unmarked squads, officers on foot and on bike. This day shift goal will be referred to as “Operation Safe Streets.”

Status: This goal was accomplished.

- The day shift will also be dedicated to keeping the motoring public safe by instituting directed patrols concentrating on areas in which there are an above average number of motor vehicle crashes.

Status: This goal has been accomplished.

- The day shift will also have every officer complete a walk-through of each school building at least one time throughout the year.

Status: This goal has been accomplished.

Goals for 2011

Goals for the upcoming year on day shift include:

- Have each officer assigned to the shift achieve the training mandated by the Police Department’s training matrix.
- Ensure that Beat 2 and Beat 4 officers remain fully engaged in DDACTS enforcement, both criminal and traffic, on main corridors in target areas along Addison Road and Fullerton Avenue.
- To become more pro-active in anticipating the needs of the community and handle any and all complaints or concerns in a timely manner. This includes having our officers spending more time outside of the patrol vehicle interacting with our residents.
- The day shift will concentrate on making the DDACTS enforcement project successful by focusing their enforcement actions on the highest crime areas within the Village.
- The day shift will also be dedicated to keeping the motoring public safe by instituting directed patrols and working with the traffic unit, concentrating on areas in which there are an above average number of motor vehicle crashes.
- The day shift will also have every officer complete a walk-through of each school building at least one time throughout the year.
