## **Problem Oriented Policing**

### **POP PROJECTS:**

P.O.P. # 5-31 A midnight shift officer opened this project to work with United Parcel Service in regards to obtaining floor plans of their facility to familiarize patrol officers with the lay out. Tours were arranged for officers to familiarize themselves with the layout. This is an ongoing project.

P.O.P. #3-58 A midnight shift officer opened this project to work with Public Works in order to locate and report any inoperable street lights within the Village of Addison. This project was closed successfully on March 17, 2011.

P.O.P. #3-60 A midnight shift officer opened this project in the Briar Hill subdivision due to an increased number of calls for service involving drug and gang activity. Increased foot patrols and the use of unmarked vehicles were used to identify offenders. This project was successfully closed on May 24, 2010.

P.O.P #5-32 A midnight shift officer opened this project in regards to updating the ban list for College Boulevard Apartments. It was determined that this complex participates in the Loitering Program negating the need for a ban list. This project was successfully closed on September 22, 2010.

P.O.P. #5-33 A midnight shift officer opened this project in regards to updating the ban list for the Indian Trail Apartments. It was determined that this complex participates in the Loitering Program negating the need for a ban list. This project was successfully closed on October 12, 2010.

**Directed Patrol:** Throughout the year, directed patrols were established with regards to underage drinking/ DUI, industrial area burglaries and thefts, and narcotics sales.

**Special Watches:** Driscoll High School from July-November 2010 for criminal activity due to the purchase of the property by the Village of Addison and the demolition.

St. Johns Place for parking violations. Citations were issued.

King's Point, Adobe, Meadows area for numerous Burglaries to Motor Vehicles. Several two-man units, unmarked units, and foot patrol details were done.

## **GOALS FROM 2010**

**1. Continue to Increase DUI enforcement, averaging one DUI per officer per month instead of the 2009 average of .97.**

*This goal was not achieved. A similar goal will be carried over into next year.*

**2. Have officers present specific roll call training on officer safety issues such as traffic stops, responding to alarms, prisoners transports, etc.**

*This goal has been achieved. The following are the roll call training ideas and a list of the ones done by patrol officers this far:*

<i>Ofc. Anderson-</i>	<i>Overview of Less Lethal Bean Bags/ WASP as all officers are not trained in the deployment of this. Done in Schedule 6.</i>
<i>Ofc. Hostetler-</i>	<i>Overview of Evidence Preservation tips for Residential and Commercial Burglaries. Done in Schedule 12.</i>
<i>Ofc. Tennyson-</i>	<i>Officer Safety Tips for Traffic Stops. Done in Schedule 13.</i>
<i>Ofc. Felton-</i>	<i>Communicating With Veterans and Post Traumatic Stress Disorders. Done in Schedule 7.</i>
<i>Ofc. Pantoja-</i>	<i>Emergency Spanish Officer Safety Phrases. Done in Schedule 7.</i>

**3. The midnight shift will have every officer complete a walk-through of each school building at least one time throughout the year.**

*This goal has been achieved.*

**4. Continue to conduct "Z" shift foot patrol and other special assignments throughout the entire year.**

*This goal has been achieved. Officers were assigned "Special Assignments" when man power allowed:*

**Schedule 1-** *Officers Rivera, Baquero, Felton, and Soto worked on "Special Assignment" to patrol high crime areas due to recent burglaries.*

**Schedule 2-** *On eight shift days, two-man patrol units were assigned to specifically address areas where rooftop and car burglaries were occurring. On three shift days Officers Rivera, Bartyzel, Soto, and Tennyson were each assigned as "Traffic Special Assignment" to increase DUI enforcement.*

**Schedule 3-** *Officers Felton, Bruesewitz, and Bartyzel worked plainclothes on two shift days to work on POP 3-60 in Briar Hill. Officers Bartyzel and Garcia also worked two shift days as "Special Truck Enforcement" with the Traffic Unit.*

**Schedule 5-** *Officers Anderson, Rivera, Hostetler, and Baquero each worked a "Z Shift Special Assignment" to increase patrol in high crime areas.*

**Schedule 8-** *Officers Rivera and Bruesewitz worked as "Special Assignment Two-Man Plain Clothes" to patrol high crime areas.*

**Schedule 9-** *Officers Rivera and Bruesewitz worked as "Special Assignment Two-Man Plain Clothes" to patrol high crime areas.*

**Schedule 10-** *Officers Rivera, Bruesewitz, Felton, and Wadsworth worked their normal shift hours in unmarked traffic cars and the tactical unit car to attempt to eliminate the numerous Burglaries to Motor Vehicles and Thefts occurring throughout town. They primarily patrolled residential areas and apartment complexes as these were the areas of highest occurrence.*

**Schedule 11-** *Officers worked their normal shift hours due to minimum manpower and use of force training. Two officers per night were assigned in an unmarked vehicle to patrol areas where car burglaries were occurring. These patrols focused in the residential areas and apartment complexes as this is where most were occurring. Patrols were done as single officer unmarked vehicle details and occasionally as two officer plain clothes unmarked vehicles.*

**Schedule 12-** *Officers worked their normal shift hours due to a high incidence of Burglary to Motor Vehicles between 2 am – 6 am. Officers paired up in two-man unmarked police vehicles to address this problem. On several other days, officers were also assigned in one-man unmarked police vehicles in high crime areas.*

**Schedule 13-** *Officers worked their normal shift hours due to an increase in tire thefts and Burglary to Motor Vehicles between 2am – 6 am. Officers paired up in two-man*

*unmarked police vehicles to address this problem. On several other days, officers were assigned in one-man unmarked police vehicles in high crime areas.*

**5. Initiate a pro-active investigation and develop informants, such as in a narcotics investigation, which utilizes all shift members so that investigative skills can be enhanced by the shift.**

*This goal was achieved in regards to the shift developing informants and cases which were forwarded to and worked on along with the Investigations Section/Tactical Unit. Officers prepared and assisted in executing several search warrants during the year*

**6. Continue to cross train with specialty units such as Detectives, Traffic, and Crime Prevention.**

*This goal was achieved.*

## **Goals for 2011:**

**1. To have officers complete school walk-throughs of each school building at least one time throughout the year.**

**2. To continue to have patrol officer involvement in Roll Call Training by having each officer on shift prepare a topic for training during one of the 13 schedules.**

**3. To encourage and mentor shift members to attend and participate in two events that build relationships with the community and promote a positive image of the Police Department such as Shop With a Cop, Lutherbrook events, Guns N Hoses, Fight For Air, Scarecrows softball, or events at the Senior Center or Student Participation Center.**

**4. Continue to cross train with specialty units such as Detectives, Traffic, and Crime Prevention.**

**5. To promote and increase physical fitness/health among shift members by providing health related information pertaining to workouts, stress, diet, and sleep at three Roll Call sessions and to achieve and maintain an overall shift fitness level of 80%.**

**6. Continue to increase DUI enforcement by increasing the arrest total by 10% or making 100 arrests which is a 10% increase over the 2010 arrest total of 91 DUI arrests.**

**7. To have four officers sufficiently trained to handle radio room relief for an hour or so until Communications help can arrive should the Communications Center be staffed on midnights by only one dispatcher.**

**8. When manpower allows add Special Patrols to DDACTS areas.**
