Back to School Safety Tips



- Instruct your child to always take a friend when walking to school. There is safety in numbers.
- Your child should stay with a group while waiting at the bus stop. If anyone bothers your child while going to and from school, you should teach your child to get away from that person and tell a trusted adult.
- Visit the bus stop with your child and learn the bus number.
- Instruct your child to say no if someone they don't know or feel comfortable with offers a ride. Children should never accept a ride from someone unless you have told them it is okay.
- Tell your child that if someone follows them on foot to get away from them as quickly as possible. If someone follows them in a car, they should turn around, go in another direction and try to quickly get to a spot where a trusted adult can help them.
- Children should be taught to never leave school with someone they don't feel comfortable with or know. They should always check first with you or another trusted adult.
- Walk the route to and from school with your children and point out landmarks and safe places to go.
