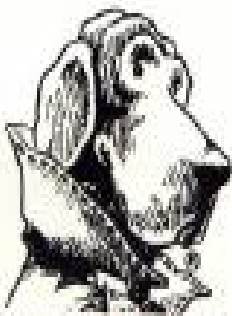
Business Watch Area

Smart 911 is a new program which allows citizens to enter information online that they want to have delivered automatically to the 9-1-1 dispatchers in the event any participant dials 9-1-1. The additional data provided is far more extensive than what is typically available to 9-1-1 dispatchers and helps to improve results when rendering aid to 9-1-1 callers.

Information can include children's photos, medical conditions, home addresses of mobile phone callers, disabilities or other rescue-related information. Smart 911 then delivers this information automatically with any 9-1-1 call to the call taker's work station at participating Public Service Answering Points (PSAPs).

The service, which is free to citizens, enhances response and supports improved incident outcomes, by providing responders with critical additional information. It also supports citizen demand for the ability to easily provide and manage special needs data. Participants can register cellular and smart phones as well as land line telephones. Watch: Issued when conditions are favorable for a particular severe weather hazard within the next several hours. **Warning:** Issued when a particular severe weather hazard is imminent or occurring. Take immediate action to protect life and property

Severe Thunderstorm/Tornado Safety Basics:

1. **Get In:**

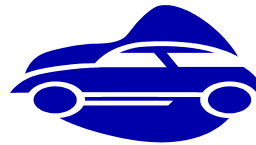
- Put as many walls between you and the outside as possible.
- Stay Away from doors and windows.

2. **Get Down:**

- Get to the lowest floor possible. Basements are best during tornadic or very high wind situations.

3. **Cover Up**

4. **Remain Calm**

Traffic Safety with Severe Weather

Severe Thunderstorms

Turn on headlights and wipers.

Listen to the radio. Tune into a local weather station for storm and traffic updates.

Hailstorm

Find shelter. Take cover by driving under an overpass or bridge.

Tornado

Never try to outrun a tornado. Get out of the car and find shelter. If you can't reach a safe structure, lie down in a ditch or low area. Stay face down to protect yourself from flying debris, and cover the back of your head and neck with your hands. Stay alert for flash floods.
