Business Watch Area

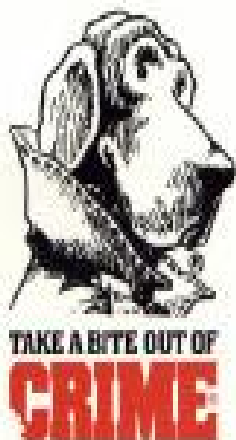

Smart 9-1-1

Smart 911 is a new program which allows citizens to enter information online that they want to have delivered automatically to the 9-1-1 dispatchers in the event any participant dials 9-1-1. The additional data provided is far more extensive than what is typically available to 9-1-1 dispatchers and helps to improve results when rendering aid to 9-1-1 callers.

Information can include children's photos, medical conditions, home addresses of mobile phone callers, disabilities or other rescue-related information. Smart 911 then delivers this information automatically with any 9-1-1 call to the call taker's work station at participating Public Service Answering Points (PSAPs).

The service, which is free to citizens, enhances response and supports improved incident outcomes, by providing responders with critical additional information. It also supports citizen demand for the ability to easily provide and manage special needs data. Participants can register cellular and smart phones as well as land line telephones. Traffic Corner

The Addison Police Department held a Roadside Safety Checkpoint on Saturday June 4, 2011, from 11:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m., at 215 North Addison Road in Addison.

The Checkpoint was a multi-jurisdictional operation involving the Addison Police Department, the Bloomington Police Department, the Lombard Police Department and the Villa Park Police Department. Additionally, members of the Addison Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and Police Explorer Post assisted with traffic control.

The goal of the checkpoint was to educate the public on the dangers of driving while impaired. While the checkpoint may be a brief inconvenience to motorists, the benefits to the motoring public outweigh the inconvenience. 376 vehicles pulled up to the checkpoint. Only 126 of them were directed into the checkpoint.

A total of 64 tickets/arrests were made during the roadside safety checkpoint.

Each driver entering the checkpoint received a letter from Chief Hayden thanking them for their cooperation and explained to purpose of the checkpoint. Most were back on their way in less than two minutes.

The Addison Police Department was happy to see there were no impaired motorists on the roadway in the vicinity of the safety checkpoint. We are happy to report that no crashes occurred between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 3:30 a.m.
